How the Program Works

As part of an effort to reduce dependence on foreign sources of energy, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 provides a tax credit to help offset the costs of making energy efficiency improvements to your home.

Some key details of the program are as follows:

- The tax credits apply to a variety of products (including installation costs) such as windows, doors, heating and cooling equipment and more.
- The amount of the credit is equal to 30% of the installed cost of the qualifying products, up to a total of \$1,500.
- If a qualifying tax credit does not total \$1,500.00, the remaining credit amount can be "banked" and earned at a later time with a separate qualifying purchase or purchases.

The Economic Advantage of Tax Credits

The reason many homeowners are so excited about this program is that tax credits, unlike deductions, are subtracted directly from the total amount you owe on your personal income taxes. For example, if you complete your tax return and calculate that you owe the IRS \$2,000, a tax credit of \$1,500 may reduce your tax bill to only \$500. Be sure to check with your tax advisor on how to best take advantage of the tax credits.

Tax Credits Available in 2009 and 2010

To take advantage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 tax credits, you must purchase your qualifying high-efficiency comfort system between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2010. Better yet, your savings won't be limited to a one-time tax credit. You'll continue saving every month with reduced monthly heating bills.

How Can I Maximize My Tax Credit?

Your tax credit will be calculated as 30% of the total installed cost of qualifying, high-efficiency products. To help you obtain your maximum credit under the new legislation, Reissmann can help you select the products that best suit your home, your comfort needs, and at the same time, deliver the highest possible credit.

- As a general rule, if your qualifying product or products total \$5,000 with installation costs, you will be eligible for the full \$1,500 credit (if you have not already purchased other qualifying energy efficient improvements)
- We recommend checking with your tax adviser on how to best take advantage of this tax credit.
